What is Aichi Biodiversity Target 11?

“By 2020, at least 17 percent of terrestrial and inland water, and 10 percent of coastal and marine areas, especially areas of particular importance for biodiversity and ecosystem services, are conserved through effectively and equitably managed, ecologically representative and well connected systems of protected areas and other effective area-based conservation measures, and integrated into the wider landscapes and seascapes”.

How is the fulfillment of the target reported?

According to the SCBD, a five-point scale is used for this evaluation.

On the way to overcoming the goal (we hope to reach the goal before its deadline)



Progress has been made towards the goal, but at an insufficient pace (unless we intensify our efforts, the goal will not be reached before its deadline)
- 

On track to reach the goal (if we stay on the current trajectory, we hope to reach the goal by 2020)



No significant progress in general, (we are not approaching the goal)

We move away from the goal (the situation is getting worse instead of better)

For the Amazon Biome

1.032 protected areas are reported

this means that currently about

33% of the biome is conserved

The countries of the biome have legal frameworks and institutional mechanisms that make social participation viable.

are currently reported


